Providing meals to Utah's older adults and other high-risk individuals during the COVID-19 pandemic

Utah's Area Agencies on Aging met the increased demand for meals for older adults and other high-risk individuals during the COVID-19 pandemic. We provided more home-delivered meals than ever before and implemented curbside pick-up meals at our Senior Centers, which helped protect our older adults when they needed it most.

During the pandemic, **Weber Human Services Area Agency on Aging** significantly increased its number of meals delivered (Meals-on-Wheels and Pickup-Meals at Senior Centers) in Weber/Morgan.

TOTAL Number of Meals Delivered by Weber/Morgan Aging: **100,276** meals (April ~ December 2019) vs **139,557** meals (April ~ December 2020)
